OAG ANNUAL PLAN & STRATEGIC PLAN WORKSHOP KICKS OFF!





OAG TRAINEE AUDITORS RESUME WITH IFTC

On February 4, 2025, the Deputy Auditor-General, Mr. Goms Menettè, officially opened the 2025 Internal Functional Training Course (IFTC).














Upon completing the training, trainees will take examinations of which a score of 70% or higher is required to pass. Successful candidates will transition from trainee auditors to senior auditors, while those who fail the examination may face termination of their contracts.




OAG AND MOHSS JOIN FORCES TO PROMOTE PUBLIC SERVICE ALCOHOL AWARENESS DAY
